### Entering Student Survey

The Entering Student Survey (ESS) survey provides baseline data about our new student population (both first year and transfer) as they enter UCLA and allows us to better understand the student experience. It was administered online during the summer and early fall quarter of 2021. #### CONCERN ABOUT ABILITY TO PAY FOR COLLEGE EDUCATION

Very Concerned	16.1%
Concerned	18.5%
Somewhat Concerned	37.4%
Not Concerned	28%

#### EXPECTATIONS FOR WORK

**55%** of students indicate it is “very likely” that they will get a job to pay for college expenses

#### ABILITY TO BUDGET

**12.8%** of students rated their current ability to budget or manage finances as “excellent”

#### COST OF ATTENDANCE

Asked whether the cost of attending UCLA is manageable:

<b>38.8%</b> Agreed or strongly agreed
<b>31.3%</b> Somewhat agreed
<b>15.6%</b> Somewhat disagreed
<b>14.2%</b> Disagreed or strongly disagreed

### HEALTH AND WELLBEING

#### PAST YEAR EXPERIENCES

**55.2%** of students rated their average stress level as “high or very high”



#### FUTURE EXPECTATIONS

##### SEEK MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

**Very likely — 22.4%**  
Somewhat likely — 48.7%  
Not at all likely — 28.9%

**31.9%** of students indicated feeling depressed, stressed or anxious as an obstacle to their academic success, “often or very often”



##### CONCERNED ABOUT ACCESS SERVICES NEEDED

Very concerned — 5.3%  
Concerned — 12.6%  
Somewhat concerned — 31.8%  
Not concerned — 50.4%

**60.9%** of students are “concerned or very concerned” about being overwhelmed with all the things they’re expected to do (socially and academically)
