# Co-Curricular Engagement and Connection: A UCUES Snapshot on Student Belonging

Engagement in co-curricular activities is one dimension of a broader student experience that supports sense of belonging at UCLA. Of undergraduate students responding to the University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES) in 2024,

85%

agreed that they belong at UCLA. (3,963/4,674)

### **Co-Curricular Activities**



77%

were involved in student organizations (3,430/4,4462)

participated in community service or volunteer activities (2,080/4,462)

participated in a leadership program (746/4,465)

## **Student Organizations**

2 +9% higher belonging than students who are not involved (96% compared to 77%).

# **Community Service/Volunteer Activities**

2 +3% higher belonging than students not participating (86% compared to 83%).

### **Leadership Program**

2 +3% higher belonging than students not participating (87% compared to 84%).



Across activities, students who participate report 3-9% higher sense of belonging than those who do not. While the effects are small\*, they are statistically significant and consistent across activities, suggesting co-curricular engagement contributes to a stronger sense of belonging.

\*Effect sizes are small (0.03-0.11) but consistent.
