
OPINIONS AND BELIEFS

OPINIONS ABOUT POLITICAL AND SOCIAL ISSUES

% indicating "agree" or "strongly agree" that...

- 89.8% Addressing global climate change should be a federal priority
- **91.4%** Sexual activity that occurs without the presence of explicit, affirmative consent (i.e., 'yes means yes') is considered sexual assault
- 90.8% Intelligence is something that can be improved by studying or working harder
- 77.6% At least a basic understanding of computer programming is important for nearly any career today
- 57.0% The chief benefit of a college education is that it increases one's earning power
- **54.1%** Students from disadvantaged social backgrounds should be given preferential treatment in college admissions
- 57.5% Through hard work, everybody can succeed in American society
- 52.0% The death penalty should be abolished
- 18.1% Federal military spending should be increased
