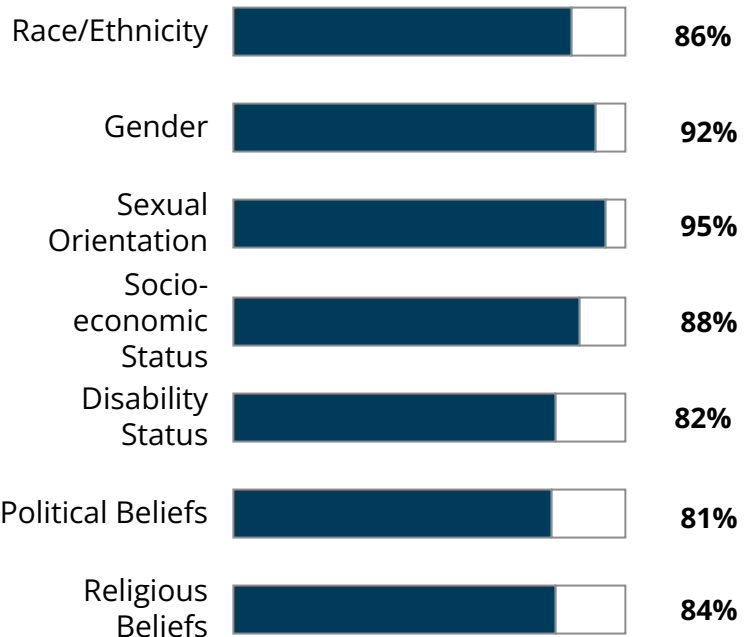
76% of total respondents agree that they feel valued as an individual at UCLA.

82% feel comfortable with the climate for diversity and inclusion at UCLA.

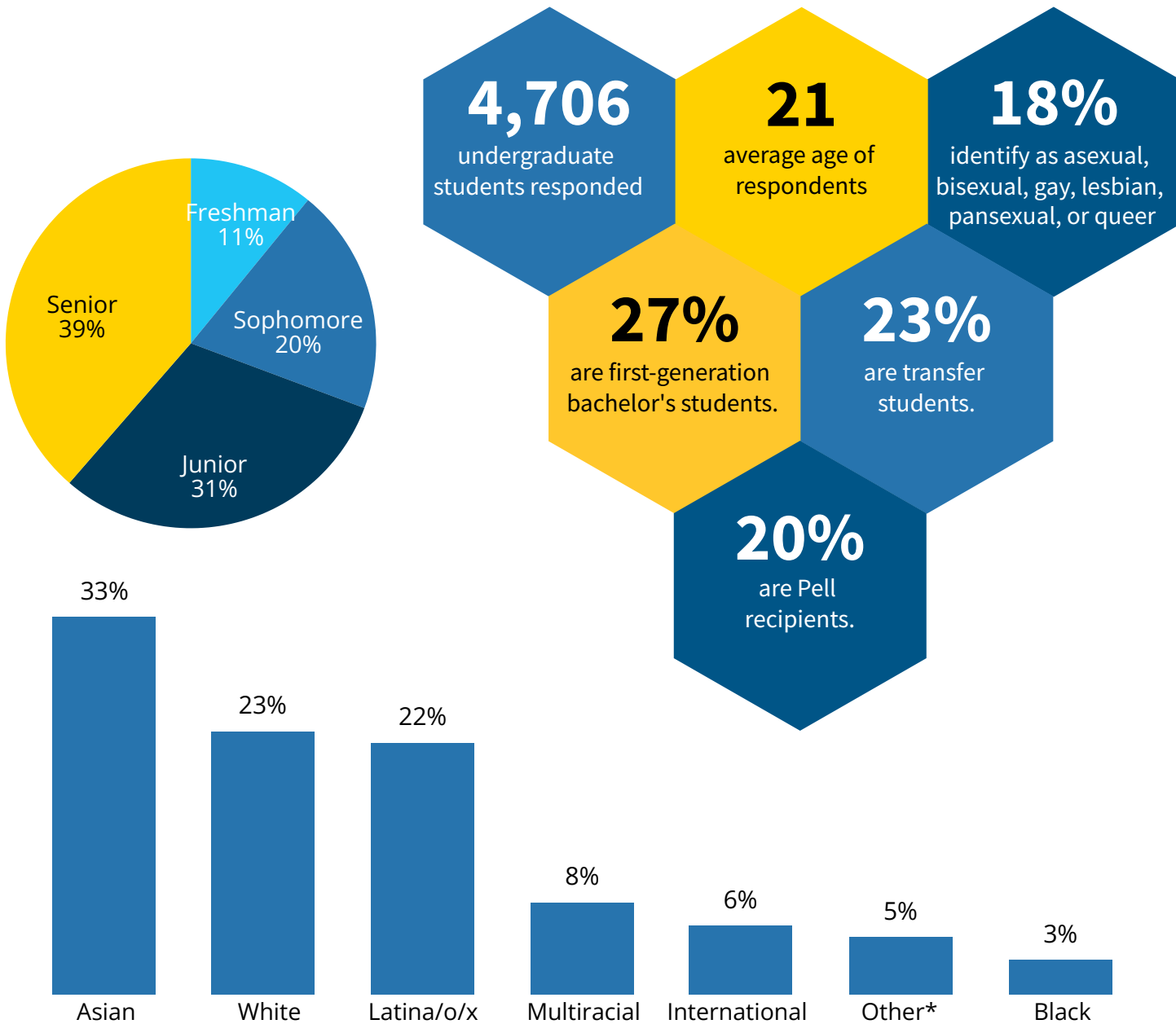
Agree That My Background in the Following Are Respected:



Potential Areas of Focus for Improving Sense of Belonging and Campus Climate at UCLA:

- 26% of Black/African American undergraduate students felt that they did not belong at UCLA (vs. 15% of all other students).
- Jewish (27%) and Muslim (28%) students reported higher levels of disagreement that UCLA is a welcoming place, relative to other groups.
